What is Cued Speech?

Cued Speech (CS) uses gestures with lip movements to convey English visually. CS facilitates English literacy. Some deaf people choose to use both ASL and CS.

Can I learn Cued Speech in a weekend?

Yes! There are only eight handshapes and four placements to learn. You will be able to cue (slowly, with notes) anything you wish to say. For further practice, attend the *two free follow-up sessions (10/17, 11/07)*.
